Dear Members and Friends of Solomon's Lutheran Faith Community!

"We had hoped" [Luke 24:21]

The one thing those two people wanted as they walked on that dusty road to Emmaus on that first Easter afternoon—was *hope*! They had been through an awful lot. It must have seemed almost too much even to hope that Jesus was alive.

We all have been through such times. Certainly not quite like those early friends and disciples of Jesus, but the similarities for each one of us is to continue to live in the hope that Jesus is alive; in the hope that God is present and active both in the dark night of the soul as well as in the dawn of new light; in the hope that God understands us in our weakness; and in the hope that Easter is always about beginning again to trust in God at all times!

The grief and discouragement, the anger and resentment—all the heaviness in the atmosphere at the beginning of the Emmaus story might be an indication of what many of us carry with us every day. *"We had hoped that He was the one..."* is what they tell the stranger walking the road. We, too, hold onto hope in many areas of our lives where it could be easier simply to give up.

Interestingly, the words of the angel at the tomb are not enough to break through the despair and disbelief. As these two men walked the road away from Jerusalem, they must have wondered what they would do now. The 'stranger' shows up on the road and begins to re-tell stories of God's faithfulness, reminding them that their faith is in *God*, that *God* can save people even when all seems lost. The words of this 'stranger' touch something deep in these two people and hope comes alive!

On Easter morning, here at Solomon's Lutheran Church, as we break bread together in a spirit of new life, my hope is that we may realize that as our hearts are burning for whatever is unsettled in our lives, in this congregation, in our world today, we believe there is new life to be found in unexpected places. May we know the hope that no matter what happens going forward, we are always wanted and loved by God!

Let's make Easter our story of hope! May it be Good News for us! May we invite the 'stranger' (who really is no stranger) to open our hearts to a new, unanticipated, exciting life!

He is Risen! He is Risen, indeed! Alleluia!

Evangelism

To Make <u>Discip</u>les of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World. What's in a name? We say that we are evangelical. In our mission statement, we claim to follow the example of Jesus Christ, and to live in the confidence and fullness of God's grace, preach the good news, support, and serve others in faith, and to work in harmony with all creation. Are we true to that statement? I myself feel I fall short. Why? Do I follow Christ's commission to go and make disciples? I think of all the opportunities and times that I failed to carry out what Christ commanded me to do. Our mission statement states we are to preach boldly and truthfully. The truthful part may not

be too hard, but the bold part is not as easy. So, what is it that stops us? Is it rejection, something we can't answer, persecution, or being afraid it may mean the loss of friends? How do we overcome the fear of evangelizing? Paul writes in Ephesians 6:10-19 to put on the whole armor of God, to pray, and to ask others to pray for you. It also says to read and study God's word. The Holy Spirit intercedes in prayer when we do not know what to pray for. (Romans 8:26). The Holy Spirit, I feel, will be with us in those times. In Acts 1:8 Jesus tells the apostles "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth." We may not be apostles, but we are disciples, and we are called to go and make disciples of all nations and baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that he has commanded. (Matthew 28:19-20). The definition of evangelism varies in the eyes of the world. True evangelism is proclaiming the Gospel in word and deed. There is no higher calling than to live out and share the message and truth of God's love.
