Pastoral Letter - Pastor Bill Nienstedt

The invitation to Lent spoken on Ash Wednesday states that "we are created for communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation." Though many Lenten practices invite us to individual acts of repentance, prayer, fasting, and giving, Lent is also a time for a deepening of community.

In the early church, and even today in some faith communities, the forty days of Lent were a time when the whole community took responsibility for teaching catechumens—preparing new disciples for entrance into the church. At the Easter Vigil on the night before Easter, catechumens would be baptized, receive their first communion, and be welcomed into membership.

Not only were the catechumens enriched by this formation, but those in the community were strengthened in their faith along with them.

Using readings from Mark's gospel, our Lenten Midweek Bible Study on Zoom will invite us to reflect on what it means to be in community with one another, with the world, with creation and with God. Each Wednesday during Lent, at 6:30 p.m., we will gather on a Zoom video conference in prayer and discussion on texts which interrelate with the Sunday readings during Lent. Following are the texts we will reflect upon:

March 3: Mark 9:2-8 *In community with all the saints*. The understanding of community expressed in the Apostles' Creed reminds us that our faith extends beyond the present time and is intertwined with those who have gone before us.

March 10: Mark 2:1-12 *In community with our neighbor*. The story of the paralyzed man brought to Jesus, highlights the way in which in takes a community to care for one another.

March 17: Mark 5:1-20 *In community with those on the margins*. When Jesus crosses over to the land of the Gerasenes, he encounters and brings healing to a man who has been left on the margins and restores him to community.

March 24: Mark 10: 32-45 *In community with Christ*. Jesus once again reminds the disciples and all of us that our call will lead to the cross.

I hope you can join us for our midweek Lenten series. Peace and joy in Christ, Pastor Bill
