Pastoral Letter - Pastor Bill Nienstedt

"As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God?" Psalm 42:1-2

Like many people, I tuned in to watch the funeral service for Prince Philip of England. While I am not a follower of the royal family, I like history and I especially wanted to see how the service was conducted. The service may have seemed a bit staid and dull by American standards, but the liturgy followed a pattern like our Lutheran order of worship.

The service reminded us how important rituals are in our corporate worship. Many details, countless small acts, and even solitary moments add up to display the support and consolation of our community, the grace of God, and the forgiving power of rituals.

While our worship service today has many modern elements, its structure dates to the earliest days of the Christian Church. Following is an excerpt from the *Didache*, a Christian worship service composed around the year 100:

Above all, we thank you because you are almighty. Glory be yours through all ages! Amen. Lord, remember your Church and deliver it from all evil; make it perfect in your love and gather it from the four winds, this sanctified Church, into your kingdom which you have prepared for it, for power and glory are yours through all ages! May the Lord come and this world pass away! Amen. (Didache 9-10)

Rituals simplify the complex. They bring order to our world of chaos and never-ending challenges. While our individual lives are small and transitory, our ritual worship connects us to the body of Christ and the whole Christian community across time and space.

Many people have told me that worship feeds their soul and gives them strength for the week ahead. And I am certain that the ritual of a memorial service gives peace to the family and friends of the departed and provides a fitting closure to the Christian life.

The death of Prince Philip is a reminder that even the most famous and powerful are mortal. Yet even the Queen showed stoicism and steadfastness in her time of grief. Some of the rituals that we have had to contend

due to the spread of COVID-19, have required that we stand apart and alone on those occasions when we most want to be with others.

But I believe the comfort and power of our rituals have brought us together and bound us to the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ.

The *Didache* contained a eucharistic prayer which still echoes through the centuries, reminding us that Jesus is with us and promises to never let us go. In closing, following is an excerpt of that prayer:

First for the cup: We thank you, our Father, for the holy vine of David your servant which you have revealed to us through Jesus your Child. Glory be yours through all ages! Then for the bread broken: We thank you, our Father, for the life and knowledge which you have revealed to us through Jesus your Child. Glory be yours through all ages!

Carol Locke was born in Allentown, PA, and grew up in nearby Schnecksville. She has happy memories of growing up in Eastern Pennsylvania and its beauty holds a special place in her heart. Carol tells me as a girl she loved to roam the woods and study nature. Their home was near what is now known as the Trexler Nature Reserve where palomino horses used to roam free. (The horses were moved to the Lehigh Valley Zoo in 2004.) She graduated from Muhlenberg College in Allentown.

Carol's career took her to many different states. She worked in the Washington, D.C./Northern Virginia region for 16+ years for Computer Sciences Corporation as a technical writer, editor, data manager (prior to computers it was all hard copy), and logistician. She would later work in New Jersey and then again in Virginia. Eventually she found herself in New Hampshire where she wrote for magazines such as *Byte*, *The Old Farmer's Almanac*, and *Yankee*.

During her 25 years in New Hampshire, she also bought a motel with a historic home and adjoining barn on the property, built in 1765, which Carol operated as a bed and breakfast. The house was home to Daniel Webster starting in 1802 and his descendants remained there until the 1920's. It is also the place where she met her husband, Lee. They will celebrate their 18th wedding anniversary this summer on July 8th.

The couple decided to try out a warmer climate and moved to Florida but soon realized they missed living up north! Carol and Lee chose Quincy Village for its beautiful grounds as well as its proximity to Carol's two sisters (one is at Menno Haven and the other lives at Leisure World in Silver Spring, MD.)

Carol came to Solomon's at the encouragement of so many of our Quincy Village members. She moved in around the same time as Alan and Marilys Johnson who invited her to visit the church. Carol says she especially enjoys hearing the hymns played on our pipe organ.

Carol still loves nature and spending time outdoors. She is also a very avid reader. Carol looks forward to returning to in person worship as the pandemic subsides. I invite you to reach out to Carol and introduce yourself when she does!
