Pastoral Letter – Pastor Bill Nienstedt

"Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God." 1 John 4:7

Recently, I asked members of our midweek Bible Study what the most important part of their faith is. There were many good responses. One individual simply said, "Love." This cuts to the heart of the gospel and Jesus' Great Commandment; "Love the Lord your God and love your neighbor as yourself." It also points to John 3:16; "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life."

During the Epiphany season, we have heard stories in worship about Jesus' sacrificial love for God's people. Jesus heals the sick and blesses the poor, the hungry and those who mourn. Jesus has shown us love so that we can love one another. Ash Wednesday, March 6, marks the beginning of Lent. You are invited to join us for Worship with Holy Communion and Imposition of Ashes at 7:00 p.m.

The forty days of Lent are a time of repentance, when we challenge ourselves to turn and follow in the way of Jesus; loving others and the world in which we live. The Lenten disciplines of fasting, prayer and giving are ways that you can focus on what really matters in life. They are ways you can focus away from your own self-absorption and toward loving others.

I encourage you to consider ways you might consume a little less in this time of Lent—being frugal with what you eat reminds you of those who don't get enough. A bonus is that you might improve your health. I am using an app called *My Fitness Pal* (free download) which tracks what you eat each day.

Another Lenten discipline is prayer. Many of you use a devotional or prayer book as part of your daily routine. *Taking Faith Home*, the weekly insert in the back of the worship bulletin, has Bible reading, prayers, devotions and family activities you can use during the week. Pull it out and take it home with you. I encourage you to write down on a piece of paper the names of people in your life who you can pray for. Pray for others around the world who are challenged by man-made or natural disasters. Pray for peace and the alleviation of hunger and human suffering. Pray for favorable weather, abundant food and clean air and water for all.

Lastly, give to others in need. Start a spare change jar at home and donate it to charity. Give to the special Lenten offering, earmarked this year for the *Good Samaritan Fund*, which provides emergency aid to those in need in our community. Support our *Relay for Life* team to fight cancer. Provide personal care items for the *Veterans Sock Ride*. Purchase paper products for the Maranatha Pantry paper drive. Volunteer with the kitchen committee to make hearty soups which are provided to the sick, recently hospitalized and those in need. Speak with me about becoming a Stephen Minister or a volunteer at the hospital. Tutor a child at school or in a club or visit a homebound person. The possibilities are endless!

Lent is the time we can model our lives after the love and grace that Jesus first showed us. I hope you experience the joy of faith through your devotional habits. Come to worship on Sundays and be nourished by Word and Sacrament. I also hope to see you at our soup suppers on Wednesdays at 6:00 p.m., followed by an informal worship service at 7:00 p.m. beginning on March 13th.

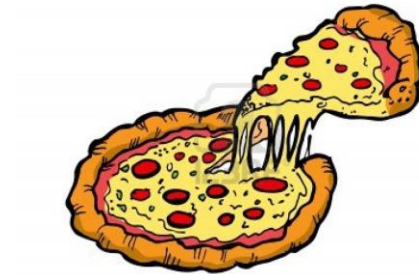
