### SECOND READING: Romans 3:19-28

A reading from Romans.

Paul's words stand at the heart of the preaching of Martin Luther and other Reformation leaders. No human beings make themselves right with God through works of the law. We are brought into a right relationship with God through the divine activity centered in Christ's death. This act is a gift of grace that liberates us from sin and empowers our faith in Jesus Christ.

<sup>19</sup>Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. <sup>20</sup>For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

<sup>21</sup>But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, <sup>22</sup>the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, <sup>23</sup>since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; <sup>24</sup>they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, <sup>25</sup>whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; <sup>26</sup>it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

<sup>27</sup>Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. <sup>28</sup>For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

# **HYMN OF THE WEEK** *A Mighty Fortress Is Our God*



### DEVOTIONS

Read: John 8:31-36.

The Gospel of John offers a relational understanding of faith, freedom, and truth. Jesus gives us a living relationship to God daily. Jesus is God in the world with us, the Word made flesh (John 1:14). Jesus says, *"I am the way, and the truth, and the life"* (John 14:6). Truth is not simply information; it is having a relationship to Jesus who is the truth. Jesus' truth sets people free to forgive sins (John 20:22-23). Those who have a relationship to Jesus grounded in trust are freed to receive grace upon grace (John 1:16), to see Jesus as Savior, to wash feet, to live in a community of faith, to see others as Jesus sees them, and much more. Word alone, faith alone, and grace alone are central themes to the Reformation. They are central to a life in Christ that sets us free from captivity to sin and sets us free to trust God in Christ and to love all people.

*Discuss:* What is it about the Reformation themes of God's Word, faith in Christ, and God's grace (undeserved kindness), that is pleasing to you and sets you free from being a slave to sin?

*Pray:* Mighty God, we thank you for your undeserved kindness that gives us an eternal relationship to you that we receive through faith in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.

### SERVICE

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, how can you help others to experience the mercy and love of Christ?

### **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**

If we want Christian children and youth, we need Christian adults who practice the faith with them. Talk about what you have learned about your faith, when you learned it, and from whom. Martin Luther wrote the Small Catechism for the head of the household to teach the Christian faith to the members of the household. If you do not have a copy of the Small Catechism, consider ordering one and then take time to look through it. Conclude by reciting the Apostle's Creed and praying the Lord's Prayer.

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
