

THE MEANING OF THIS DAY

On this Christmas morning we take time from our family celebrations to remember what we're celebrating. The people of God gather to celebrate the birth of the Word made flesh, Christ our Lord. John's gospel tells of the Word that dwells among us, full of grace and truth. The meaning of Christmas is made clear: the light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it. Immanuel, God-with-us, is come into the world. Let us adore Him! Nourished by God's Word and the meal of Holy Communion, we move out to share the light with our families and neighbors.

CHRISTMAS LITANY

DEVOTIONS

Read: John 1:1-14.

faith 1 The star home John's introduction of Jesus points to a world of contrasts between darkness and light, that is, between the power of fear and deception and the light of God that brings grace, and truth. The arrival of Jesus, the Word that became flesh and now dwells among us, sheds light on what true power and real life looks like: it's the glory of grace and truth. Grace is that divine gift of underserved kindness. In John truth is more than facts. It is a way of life lived in relationship to Jesus, who is "the way, the truth and the life" (John 14:6). Jesus comes to shed light on that which brings God's glory and creates goodness and life. Through the Word that became flesh, all created life has come into being. Powers that live in darkness are not life-giving. The good news to hear this Christmas and always—is that Jesus' light overcomes darkness. Jesus is the source of all that is lifegiving, that which is full of grace and truth for all. It is the power worth knowing and trusting.

Discuss: Where have you seen the powers of darkness at work in the world? Where have you seen the powers of grace and truth at work in the world? Pray: God of glory and might, we thank you for your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, the light of the world, who brings your grace and truth to conquer all the darkness of sin and evil. Amen.

SERVICE

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings for this week, how might you help others to have hope in the God of grace and truth?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

During the four weeks of Advent, we prepared our hearts and minds for the day of Jesus' birth and his coming again. Light the four candles of hope, peace, joy, and love on the Advent wreath. Then light the white one, the Christ candle, in the center of the wreath. This week, we focus on God's unconditional love for us and our love for one another. Dim the lights in the room and have a moment of silence to gaze upon the candles. Leader: The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. (John 1:5) All: Come, let us walk in the light of the Lord, the light of Christ that gives us hope, peace, joy, and love.
