### SECOND READING: Romans 7:15-25a


A reading from Romans.

Life captive to sin is a catch-22 existence in which we know good but do not do it and do things we know to be wrong. Through Jesus Christ, God has set us free from such a futile existence.

<sup>15</sup>I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. <sup>16</sup>Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. <sup>17</sup>But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. <sup>18</sup>For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. <sup>19</sup>For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. <sup>20</sup>Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me.




#### COMMUNION

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

# **HYMN OF THE WEEK** *I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say*

#### DEVOTIONS

Read: Romans 7:15-25a.

Paul has a deep understanding of our

brokenness. We are not what we want to be. Although we know what is the right thing to do, we do not do it, at least not consistently. Paul calls this inconsistency sin. We like to think we are in control of our thoughts and actions. However, Paul experiences the power of sin within him that does not submit to God's goodness. He states clearly, *"For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do"* (v. 19). He calls this way of life *"wretched"* (v. 24). It seems there is no hope for us, but that is exactly why we need Jesus. Only sinners can be saved or *"rescued"* (v. 24). In the language of Jesus in Matthew 11:28, we are *"weary and are carrying heavy burdens."* In our brokenness, Jesus brings healing, rescues us from the power of sin, and gives us rest and peace. The response of faith is: *"Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord"* (Romans 7:25a). *Discuss:* When have you faced brokenness and become aware of God's forgiveness that heals your heavy burdens?

#### SERVICE

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings for this week, how might you serve others when they are tired and weary?

### **RITUALS AND TRADITIONS**

A yoke is a wooden piece that joins two animals together, usually oxen, to help pull a plow. The work becomes easier with two pulling. In Matthew 11:29, Jesus says, *"take my yoke upon you, and learn from me."* There are days when we feel like we are carrying heavy burdens without support from someone else. Jesus reminds us that we are not alone. Think or talk about what it means to be connected with one another through Jesus and how it helps us to "bear one another's burdens."

*Pray:* Lord Jesus, help us to share your love with one another and be yoked to you so that our burdens are lifted. Amen.

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
