**CROP Walk**--Solomon's will participate in the annual area CROP Hunger Walk in downtown Chambersburg on **Sunday, October 20th.** It is sponsored by Church World Service. The program began shortly after World War II with the letters standing for "Christian Rural Overseas Program" with the food going to hungry and hurting people in Europe and Asia.

Today CROP stands for "Communities Responding to Overcome Poverty". Its goal is to promote food self-sufficiency through training and appropriate technology. Over the years the Chambersburg Area Crop Walk has raised thousands of dollars in support to the Salvation Army, Chambersburg Food Pantry, Fruitbelt Farmworkers Christian Ministry and world-wide hunger relief programs.

The walk will commence from **Zion Reformed Church**, 259 S. Main Street, Chambersburg. Registration begins at 1:00 pm and **the walk starts at 1:30 pm**. Along with proceeds collected, walkers are encouraged to bring non-perishable food items that will be donated to the Chambersburg Area Food Pantry.
