
COMMUNION



Hymn Notes

Our Hymn of the Day this morning, (as well as the organ prelude) Children of the Heavenly Father, is a Scandinavian hymn, whose text was written by Carolina Sandell-Berg. She suffered from ill health most of her life, and out of her health experiences, she wrote many poems and hymns. When she was 26, she and her father were traveling by boat and he fell overboard and drowned. Again, from this tragedy which she witnessed, she wrote many more poems and hymns, including her classic, "Day by Day and With Each Passing Moment." Some hymn histories claim that "Children of the Heavenly Father" was written in response to her father's death, but it was first published in 1855, 3 years before he died. Regardless of when or why it was written, the hymn reassures us that there is an eternal father who can never be taken from us in life or death—a father that comforts, protects, tends and nourishes unceasingly. The gorgeous melody, a Swedish folk tune, is just as comforting as the lyrics, lifting the soul and calming the spirit. (Robert Morgan, Then Sings My Soul, Vol 2; and Hymnary.org).

The text to our communion hymn this morning, "Jesus Loves Me This I Know," was written by Anna B. Warner, who along with her sister, Susan, lived in New York City, until the "Panic of 1837" wrecked their family's finances. This event forced them to move into a "ramshackle Revolutionary War-era home" on Constitution Island across from the Military Academy at West Point. In an effort to help their family's financial situation, the two sisters began writing poems and stories for publication. One of their most successful joint projects was a novel, Say and Seal, in which a little boy is dying. His Sunday School teacher takes the child into his arms, rocks him, and speaks the words from Anna's poem, "Jesus loves me this I

know..." to the dying child. The novel soon became a best seller and when Wiliam Bradbury read the words, he composed a childlike melody that quickly made this text one of the best known children's hymns. The two sisters never really seemed to recover from their financial hardships, however. For forty years, they conducted Bible classes for cadets at West Point. Both sisters were buried with full military honors, the only civilians buried in the military cemetery at West Point. Their home on Constitution Island is maintained by the Academy as a museum to their memory. (Then Sings My Soul, Robert J. Morgan and Hymnary.org).
