# First Sunday of Advent

# **Music Notes/Hymn Notes:**

Our closing hymn today, "People, Look East," was written by Eleanor Farjeon (1881-1965). Farjeon grew up in England and is best known there as the author of more than eighty children's books and poems. In the United States, Farjeon's best-known work is the hymn "Morning Has Broken" which is included in our current hymnal. "People, Look East" first appeared in *The Oxford Book of Carols* (1928). The lively tune provides a festive setting for this wonderful Advent text. Key images of the season are abundant. "People, Look East" is the direction of the rising sun and, in the history of Christianity, the direction of the coming Messiah. In stanza two, the bare earth is waiting for the seed that will flourish in the reign of the Promised One. In stanza three, the stars that guided the Magi shape the "bowl" of the heavens, giving signs of hope beyond "the frosty weather." The angels' song, in stanza four, sets "every peak and valley humming," a reference to Isaiah 40:4, "Every valley shall be exalted and every mountain and hill brought low." Except for one word that changes in the last two lines of each stanza, the poem and its musical setting give the sense of a refrain. "Love," in turn, is defined as "Guest," "Rose," "Star," and "Lord." This joyful Advent hymn has the spirit of a Christmas carol, but with an imaginative Advent text. Singing this carol is indeed one way to prepare both our homes and hearts for the coming of our Savior. (Discipleship Ministries: UMC).

**Hymn Notes:** Many songs have been inspired by happy times, but today's Hymn of the Day, "Wake, Awake for Night is Flying," was inspired by the worst of times. Philip Nicolai was a Lutheran pastor in Unna, Germany when the plague did its terrible work in the winter of 1597-1598. The plague took the lives of more than 1300 people in his community. He kept busy all winter conducting funerals, and comforting the sick and grieving. He wrote this hymn as an encouragement—a statement of faith in the coming of

the Christ who overcame death on the cross—and who overcomes death for us as well. In most cases, a poet writes the words to a hymn and a musician adds the tune. However, in this case, Nicolai wrote both words and music. Johann Sebastian Bach came across Nicolai's hymn and made some small changes to make it more singable. In the process, Bach also helped to popularize it. The hymn was based on the Parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins in Matthew 25:1-13. Although not our Gospel reading today, the hymn still relates to our readings. "Be on guard...be alert at all times" are phrases from today's Gospel reading. The opening stanza calls the followers of Christ to be roused and alert for His Second Coming. Stanza 2 describes the joyous scene when the Bridegroom returns and takes His bride, the church, in to the wedding feast. Finally, the third stanza adores the Lamb of God and describes the glorious scene in heaven, as given in Revelation 19 and 21, where the saints will worship in song forever.
