




COMMUNION

Hymn Notes:

One of the most effective and simple costume changes someone can make is to put on a hat. When you walk off stage and return wearing a top hat, you are suddenly a different person. A "man of many hats" is someone who can be a different person in different contexts or crowds. "Crown Him With Many Crowns," is a hymn that declares we are to crown our Lord with many crowns, but this does not mean that Jesus is a "man of many hats." Christ was not simply a prophet, He was not simply the carpenter's son, and He was not simply human, nor simply divine. Rather, this call to "crown him with many crowns" is a simple and yet profound declaration that Christ is many things, and everything. He is Lord of all. Each crown represents a different aspect of who Christ is — Lord of life, Lord of love, Lord of years, Lord of heaven, the Lamb upon the throne. Christ is King, Servant, Lamb, Shepherd, and we celebrate this all-encompassing nature of our Savior by crowning Him the Lord of all. Join in as we sing this beautiful hymn to open worship on this, Christ the King Sunday! (Hymnary.org)

Schonster, Herr Jesu, known to us as Beautiful Savior, our communion hymn this morning, dates back to the Roman Catholic Jesuits in a hymnal dated 1677, although it was also found in a manuscript dated 1662. The actual translator remains a mystery, The hymn emphasizes "the beauty and wonder of Christ, and it alludes to His dual nature, that He was both human and divine, God made flesh,"Son of God and Son of Man." (Then Sings My Soul, p.25). It is interesting to note that according to some accounts, this hymn was called "Crusader's Hymn" because it was sung by German Crusaders as they made their way to the Holy Land. But William Jensen Reynolds dismisses as "completely erroneous" any association of this hymn with the Crusades. Regardless of its exact origins, the hymn is truly a beautiful one, and a favorite of many. (Wikipedia). You will hear the hymn in three different forms this morning: first an organ arrangement of the tune as the prelude; next as the choir anthem, but with a new melody with hints of the original woven in; and finally, as the communion hymn.
