Pastoral Letter - Pastor Mike Allwein

Dear family and friends of Solomons Lutheran Faith Community!

"When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child....[Mt. 2:10-11]

In the movie, *Waking New Divine*, a ten-year-old boy asks the interim pastor at his church, "Do you ever see God?" "No" the pastor says, "the rewards of my job are mostly spiritual and that is enough." Then the pastor asks the boy, "have you ever thought about a life of service to the church?" "Not really," says the boy. "I don't want to work for someone I never see and who doesn't even pay minimum wage."

This humorous exchange between the pastor and the young boy gets me thinking about the season of Epiphany. Epiphany—the festival day when we remember the coming of the foreigners, the Magi, to bring gifts to the infant Jesus—is celebrated on January 6, the twelfth day of Christmas.

Christmas/Epiphany is not meant to leave us with nothing more than a child's perception of what it means to see a baby in a manger scene. It is meant to take us to the level of spiritual maturity where we are capable of seeing in a manger the meaning of the empty tomb. It is meant to enable us to see through the dark days the stars beyond them.

This is our time of recalling how we see Jesus in our daily lives. During these seven weeks until the beginning of Lent, the second lesson each Sunday is taken from Paul's letter to the Corinthians, Paul's firm but grace-filled letter to a community at odds with itself. Paul uses the analogy of the human body to challenge all the baptized in the Body of Christ to see the wonder and beauty of such a diverse community.

Despite the overall arc of the Epiphany season—looking for the deeper presence of the incarnated Christ—when we look at the scripture readings for this Epiphany season, we realize how the stories are rife with contradiction and conflict. Amid the present moment of lives in turmoil, isolation and distress, the promise of Christ is an astonishing contradiction. Through the One made known to mysterious travelers from afar, we find meaning and hope. The dawn of a new age calls us into community where, despite our differences and our despair, we are formed to live with one another and all creation in faith, hope, and—the greatest of these—love!
