

FIRST READING: Isaiah 43:1-7

A reading from Isaiah.

Near the end of Israel's exile in Babylon, God promises to bring the people home. They need no longer be afraid, because the one who formed, created, and called them by name now redeems them from all their enemies. God declares them precious and honored, and God loves them.

¹ But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. ² When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. ³ For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. 
SECOND READING: Acts 8:14-17

A reading from Acts.

Peter and John are sent to support the new Christians in Samaria, a group that was recently baptized after hearing the good news of Christ through the preaching of Philip. Here the Samaritans receive the gift of the Holy Spirit in the laying on of hands.

¹⁴ Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. ¹⁵ The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit ¹⁶ (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). ¹⁷ Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

*GOSPEL: Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

The holy gospel according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.


The reading opens with questions about the identity of the Messiah. John the Baptist insists that he is not the Messiah; instead he points ahead to one who is coming. And whether the voice of God was heard by all or only by Jesus, God settles the matter: Jesus is God's beloved Son.

¹⁵ As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, ¹⁶ John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷ His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

²¹ Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, ²² and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."



Hymn Notes

Our gathering hymn this morning, "Songs of Thankfulness and Praise," is found in the "Time after Epiphany" section of our hymnal. The word "epiphany" means "manifestation" of Christ in the world. The text was written by Christopher Wordsworth, with the harmonization in our hymnal written by Johann Sebastian Bach. Wordsworth used the word "manifest" eleven times (my source said he used it twelve, but I only found 11) to describe Christ's birth, baptism, appearance at the wedding in Cana, healing the sick, and his powers over evil. The hymn is not only one of praise to God, but a time for learning more about Epiphany and about Christ himself. (Hymn Notes for Church Bulletins; Austin Lovelace).

"Go, My Children, with My Blessing," was written by Rev. Jaroslav Vajda. It was published in 1983 and appeared in *With One Voice*, the songbook supplement of the ELCA in 1995. This hymn has special meaning to Mary-Jo Bedsworth, as Pastor Vajda was her pastor at her home church near Pittsburgh. After leaving her home congregation, Pastor Vajda went on to Concordia Publishing House in St. Louis, and it was while he was there that he began writing hymns of his own, instead of just translating hymns into English from another language, in his case, Slovak. He published several collections of hymns after retiring from Concordia Publishing, *Now the Joyful Celebration* (1987) and its sequel *So Much to Sing About* (1991). This hymn was set to the tune "All Through the Night," making it an instant hit. People love this hymn for its "healing language and blessings, a benediction for life." (Hymnfortheday.com). The hymn truly blesses us with God's grace. If you look in our ELW, Pastor Vajda has several hymnal committees, including our former LBW, and the *Lutheran Worship* hymnal of the Missouri Synod when it broke off from the LBW.
