

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 12:1-11

A reading from 1 Corinthians.

The congregation at Corinth experienced division as people were comparing their spiritual gifts, thinking some to be superior to others. Paul invites this fractured community to trust that God's Holy Spirit has gifted them all perfectly for their mission together.

- ¹ Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. ² You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. ³ Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit.
- ⁴ Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸ To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, ⁹ to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰ to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹ All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

Turning water to wine at the wedding at Cana is described as the first of Jesus' signs. Through many such epiphanies, Jesus reveals that he bears God's creative power and joyful presence into the world.

¹ On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. ² Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. ³ When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." ⁴ And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." ⁵ His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." ⁶ Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. ⁷ Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. ⁸ He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. ⁹ When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom ¹0 and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." ¹¹¹ Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.





Hymn/Music Notes:

Our hymn of the day, *Soul, Adorn Yourself with Gladness*, also known as *Deck Thyself My Soul with Gladness*, was written by Johann Frank (1618-1677). Frank was born in Brandenburg, Germany, where he practiced law during the Thirty Years' War. In addition, he held several positions in civil service, among them as burgomaster (mayor). It was not unusual for a mayor to write poetry/hymns (he actually wrote 110), but credit must go to Johann Cruger (1598-1662), who composed the tune and later included Frank's text in his (Cruger's) collection of hymns. The hymn was later translated into English by Catherine Winkworth. Although the hymn is often sung for Holy Thursday worship services, it is included in our hymnal in the section of hymns for Holy Communion. (Dianaleighmatthews.com; <u>Hymn Notes for Church Bulletins</u>, Austin C. Lovelace)

Our sending hymn this morning, We All Are One in Mission, is a relatively new hymn, written in 1985 by Dr. Rusty Edwards (b. 1955). The unity of the church is at the heart of this hymn. Edwards says, "It is not the responsibility of only missionaries or ordained clergy to practice mission in all of its forms but it is integral to the service of all in the church." We All Are One in Mission is found in Dr. Edwards' first collection of hymns, The Yes of the Heart: Faith, Hope and Love Songs (Hope Publishing Co., 1993), as well as in numerous recent hymnals. It is the most published of all his hymns and appears in over two dozen collections and hymnals. The hymn was included in the With One Voice hymnal, published by Augsburg Fortress in 1995. In addition to We All Are One in Mission, Dr. Edwards has 4 other hymns in the ELW for which he wrote the text and/or the tune. These include: 464, 572,843, and 862. (umcdiscipleship.org)

Both the prelude and postlude this morning are based on our Hymn of the Day, *Soul Adorn Yourself with Gladness*. Written by two contemporary composers, they are different in style, but both enable the listener to hear the melody of the hymn. Wayne T. Wold is Director of Music Ministry at First Lutheran Church in Ellicott City, Maryland, and Adjunct Associate Professor of Music (organ) at Shenandoah Conservatory of Shenandoah University in Winchester, Virginia. Kenneth Kosche is emeritus Professor of Music, Concordia University Wisconsin, and continues as a parish musician in Billings, Montana. Both men continue to compose music for organ and choirs.
