# FIRST READING: Genesis 45:3-11, 15

A reading from Genesis.

Many years after being sold into slavery by his jealous brothers, Joseph reveals himself to them. Now the second-in-command in Egypt, Joseph reassures his brothers that God has used their evil intentions for good to preserve life during a devastating famine, and Joseph forgives them.

<sup>3</sup> Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph. Is my father still alive?" But his brothers could not answer him, so dismayed were they at his presence.

<sup>4</sup> Then Joseph said to his brothers, "Come closer to me." And they came closer. He said, "I am your brother, Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt. <sup>5</sup> And now do not be distressed, or angry with yourselves, because you sold me here; for God sent me before you to preserve life. <sup>6</sup> For the famine has been in the land these two years; and there are five more years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvest. <sup>7</sup> God sent me before you to preserve for you a remnant on earth, and to keep alive for you many survivors. <sup>8</sup> So it was not you who sent me here, but God; he has made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house and ruler over all the land of Egypt. <sup>9</sup> Hurry and go up to my father and say to him, 'Thus says your son Joseph, God has made me lord of all Egypt; come down to me, do not delay. <sup>10</sup> You shall settle in the land of Goshen, and you shall be near me, you and your children and your children's children, as well as your flocks, your herds, and all that you have. <sup>11</sup> I will provide for you there—since there are five more years of famine to come—so that you and your household, and all that you have, will not come to poverty.'" <sup>15</sup> And he kissed all his brothers and wept upon them; and after that his brothers talked with him.

# SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 15:35-38, 42-50

A reading from 1 Corinthians.

In the Apostles' Creed, we speak of the "resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting." Using the metaphor of a planted seed and the story of Adam, Paul preaches passionately about the mystery of following Christ's perfect life into eternity.

<sup>35</sup> But someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" <sup>36</sup> Fool! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. <sup>37</sup> And as for what you sow, you do not sow the body that is to be, but a bare seed, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. <sup>38</sup> But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body.

<sup>42</sup> So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. <sup>43</sup> It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised in power. <sup>44</sup> It is sown a physical body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual body. <sup>45</sup> Thus it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. <sup>46</sup> But it is not the spiritual that is first, but the physical, and then the spiritual. <sup>47</sup> The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. <sup>48</sup> As was the man of dust, so are those who are of the dust; and as is the man of dust, we will also bear the image of the man of heaven.

<sup>50</sup> What I am saying, brothers and sisters, is this: flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable.

Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

The holy gospel according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus continues to address a crowd of his disciples. He invites his followers to shower radical love, blessing, forgiveness, generosity, and trust even on enemies and outsiders. Living in harmony with God's intent brings the reward of overflowing blessing.



For even sinners love those who love them. <sup>33</sup> If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? <sup>37</sup> "Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; <sup>38</sup> give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back."





# Music Notes/Hymn Notes:

The prelude this morning is part of a partita written by Charles Callahan. In the second part, *Andante*, in the composer's notes, he wrote "written in homage to J.S. Bach," as it is in the style of some of Bach's more "ornamented" compositions.

Our communion hymn this morning, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds," was written by John Fawcett (1740-1817). Fawcett was an English Baptist minister serving a rather poor country church when he received a call to serve a larger and more prestigious church in London. After preaching his farewell sermon and loading his luggage on wagons, his congregation pleaded with him to reconsider and remain their pastor. He decided he would rather stay with his fellowship in the smaller country church. Fawcett apparently wrote this hymn to commemorate his choice to turn down prestige and profit and remain at the poorer, humbler church in Wainsgate. He served as their pastor for the remainder of his life. The theme of this hymn is the fellowship of Christian believers. It is often used as a closing prayer for many gatherings. (*Hymn Notes for Church Bulletins*; Austin Lovelace, p. 18 and Christianity.com).

Our sending hymn this morning, "Softly and Tenderly," originally known as "Softly and Tenderly Jesus is Calling," is a classic invitation hymn from the 19<sup>th</sup> century. It was written by Will Lamartine Thompson (1847-1909) who began as a composer of gospel, secular, and patriotic songs. Due to earlier songs being rejected by other publishers, Thompson formed his own music publishing company and "Softly and Tenderly" was first published in a collection titled *Sparkling Gems Nos. 1 and 2 Combined*. The hymn quickly became popular and was published in many church hymnals. After becoming a successful song writer, Thompson dedicated himself to writing Christian songs. A simple and sincere man, he felt people in rural areas seldom had anyone come to minister to them. He loaded an upright piano in a two-horse wagon and went into the countryside to sing and play his songs in the Midwest. Thompson was inspired to devote himself to writing while attending a meeting by popular evangelist Dwight L. Moody (1837-1899). When Moody was dying in the hospital he told Thompson, "Will, I would rather have written 'Softly and Tenderly Jesus Is Calling' than anything I have been able to do in my whole life." (Then Sings My Soul, Book 2; Robertt J. Morgan p.182).
