### Pastoral Letter – Pastor Michael Allwein

Dear members and friends of Solomon's Lutheran faith community!

#### "Create in me a clean heart, O God!" [Psalm 51:10]

I began writing this message in the midst of a freezer-like cold that is griping our area for several days. Although Ash Wednesday is still a few weeks away, by the time you will be reading this "Pastor's Message," we will be at the very beginning of our season of Lent. More than any other season of the Church Year, Lent feels to me to be a time of living into a deeper understanding of what it means to be a community of faith. Lent continues to be a vibrant invitation to Christians to live into the Resurrection, the celebration that Jesus Christ is alive in the lives of all people.

Today it is through the memory of the Cross and the empty tomb that the Christian community grows more and more deeply into Jesus and all that Jesus stood for in his life. Each succeeding Lent calls us to renew our ongoing commitment to the implications of the Resurrection in our lives today. That demands of us the healing of the soul, penance and faith, a purging of what is superfluous in our lives, and the heightening and intensifying of what is meaningful.

Lent is a call for renewed commitment to move from a life marked by routine to a life marked by reflection. Lent requires each of us to stop for a while, to move beyond a life of mundane regularity or unconsidered adherence to the trappings of faith, to reflect, yet again, on what is going on within each one of us. Lent is about internal change, realigning our wills and God's will by taking on the heart and

mind of Jesus. Lent is about allowing any obstacle of grace to be removed, leading to a deeper love of God!

Maybe it is best said that Lent is a time given over to think seriously about who Jesus is for me/us, to renew our faith from the inside out, refreshed and reoriented. The voice of Lent need not be a sour one. It is a call to remember who we are and where we have come from and why. The voice of Lent cries to us to live on in a new way no matter what our Ives have been like until now.

Lent is even more than that. It is the promise of mercy, the guarantee of new life. It is the resilience that keeps our souls melded to the Spirit despite the pull of chaos and waste and superficialities, tugging on our spiritual anchors. Lent is our salvation from the depths of nothingness. It is our guide to the "genuine" life—such an important, essential time in our society today, necessary to have this anchor of Lent at close hand.

Let's journey together as Solomon's faith community this 40-day journey
