A reading from Acts.

Dorcas was a faithful and devoted woman of charity in the community of Joppa. Her kindness and her work with clothing were well-known, especially to the widows in town. When she fell ill and died, Peter raised her back to life through the power of prayer.

<sup>36</sup> Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. <sup>37</sup> At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. <sup>38</sup> Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." <sup>39</sup> So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. <sup>42</sup> This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. <sup>43</sup> Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.







# Hymn Notes:

Our Hymn of the Day, "The King of Love My Shepherd Is," is a beautiful rendition of Psalm 23. It was written by Henry William Baker, an ordained minister in England, later vicar of Monkland, and also, after his father's death, a baronet. For many years, Baker

worked on a book of hymns which he wanted to reflect the "grandeur of majestic worship." The "King of Love" appeared in the 1868 revision of his Anglican hymnal. When he passed away in 1877, a friend reported that his last words were from this great hymn: *Perverse and foolish oft I strayed, But yet in love He sought me, And on His shoulder gently laid, And home, rejoicing, brought me.* This hymn was the best known of the many hymns written by Baker during his lifetime. (*Then Sings My Soul;* Robert J. Morgan; p. 168)

Our sending hymn this morning, "Go, My Children, with My Blessing," was written by Rev. Jaroslav Vajda (1919-2008), an American hymnist ad ordained pastor. It was published in 1983 and appeared in *With One Voice*, the songbook supplement of the ELCA in 1995. Pastor Vajda served several congregations of the Missouri Synod before making a move to Concordia Publishing in St. Louis, where he served as editor of *This Day* magazine. While at Concordia, he began writing hymns of his own, instead of just translating hymns into English from his native Slovak language. He published several collections of hymns after his retirement, *Now the Joyful Celebration* (1987) and its sequel *So Much to Sing About* (1991). Today's sending hymn for its "healing language and blessings, a benediction for life." The hymn truly blesses us with God's grace. (Hymnfortheday.com). If you look in our ELW, Pastor Vajda has several hymn texts included: 285, 460, 543, 602, 740, and 795. It is interesting to note that he served on several hymnal committees, including our former LBW, and the *Lutheran Worship* hymnal of the Missouri Synod when the Missouri synod broke away from the development of the LBW.
