FIRST READING: Acts 16:16-34

A reading from Acts.

Those who had enslaved a girl and used her powers to tell fortunes threw Paul and Silas into jail for ordering the spirit to come out of her and consequently ruining their business. In prison, Paul and Silas bring the good news of the gospel to the jailer and his family.

¹⁶ One day, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave-girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. ¹⁷ While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God,

who proclaim to you a way of salvation." ¹⁸ She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour.

Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. ²⁰ When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews ²¹ and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe." ²² The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. ²³ After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. ²⁴ Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

²⁵ About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶ Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. ²⁷ When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. ²⁸ But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." ²⁹ The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. ³⁰ Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹ They answered, "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." ³² They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. ³³ At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. ³⁴ He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.


*PREFACE



Hymn Notes:

The background to a hymn that bears repeating this morning: One of the most effective and simple costume changes someone can make is to put on a hat. When you walk off stage and return wearing a top hat, you are suddenly a different person. A "man of many hats" is someone who can be a different person in different contexts or crowds. "Crown Him With Many Crowns," is a hymn that declares we are to crown our Lord with many crowns, but this does not mean that Jesus is a "man of many hats." Christ was not simply a prophet, He was not simply the carpenter's son, and He was not simply human, nor simply divine. Rather, this call to "crown him with many crowns" is a simple and yet profound declaration that Christ is many things, and everything. He is Lord of all. Each crown represents a different aspect of who Christ is — Lord of life, Lord of love, Lord of years, Lord of heaven, the Lamb upon the throne. Christ is King, Servant, Lamb, Shepherd, and we celebrate this all-encompassing nature of our Savior by crowning Him the Lord of all. (hymnary.org). Join in as we sing this beautiful hymn to open worship on this 7th and final Sunday of Easter.

Katherine K. Davis (1892-1980) wrote the text for our sending hymn, "Let All Things Now Living" specifically for the tune ASH GROVE in the 1920s. The text was first published as an anthem and descant setting in 1939 under the name John Crowley, one of several pseudonyms she used. A fine song of praise and thanksgiving, it employs Old Testament images, calling forth praise from all cfreatures, directing that praise to God, our Creator (vs.1). In vs. 2, we join our voices with the entire universe in a song of "hosanna and praie." This hymn became increasingly popular, partly due to the memorable Welsh tune, ASH GROVE. It appears in many hymnals today. An interesting note, Davis wrote "The Little Drummer Boy" in 1941, under her pseudonym, John Crowley. (hymnary.org; Hymn Notes for Church Bulletins, Austin C. Lovelace, pg. 61)
