Pastoral Letter - Pastor Bill Nienstedt

Lent is an important season for the people of God at Solomon's. It's a time for us to reflect on Jesus' temptation in the wilderness, his loneliness in the Garden of Gethsemane, his death on the cross, and our dependence on God's grace and mercy. The promise of Easter supports us and leads us through our own wilderness in this season of confession, repentance, and for many, fasting.

Through the prophet Isaiah, God reveals to us the depth and breadth of authentic fasting: "Is not this the fast I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?" (Isaiah 58:6) Jesus calls us to love God and love our neighbor. Lent is an excellent time to remember how much Jesus has given to you and share his grace by giving back to others. Fasting, in and of itself, is of little value without justice and mercy for God's people.

Our Lenten special offering this year is earmarked for the Gleaning Project of the South Central Community Action Program. Its threefold mission is: 1.) Make good use of agricultural excess, 2.) Reduce food insecurity and improve community health and 3.) Connect our community in order to efficiently and effectively serve the hungry.

Consider making your Lenten fast have a lasting impact on hunger in our community by giving a special offering to the Gleaning Project beginning on Ash Wednesday and continuing through the five midweek soup suppers and worship services up to Maundy Thursday. You can also place your Lenten offering in the plate on Sunday during worship (mark your gift "Lenten Offering.")

In addition, I invite you to explore a new way(s) to pray and center your spiritual life during Lent. Spend some quiet time in personal prayer and meditation each day. Read a text from the Bible as a daily devotion. Read the daily devotional provided by Christian Education and use the *Taking Faith Home* resource attached to the bulletin each week. Try spontaneous prayer—that is, pray for others who spring up in your thoughts or you see in your daily life. Find a partner to share prayer together. Start a spiritual journal. Come to the midweek soup suppers and Wednesday evening worship. Provide a service to someone in need as a discipline of prayer.

You will find the schedule of our Lenten services in this newsletter. I pray that you will find the disciplines of Lent a joyful opportunity to live out your faith rather than an obligation or chore.
