Pastoral Letter – Pastor Bill Nienstedt

"Now thank we now our God with hearts and minds and voices, who wonderous things has done, in whom this world rejoices." ELW 839, 849

Many of us are familiar with the beautiful Martin Rinkart hymn, *Now Thank We All Our God.* Martin Rinkart was a Lutheran pastor who served in Germany in the 17th century. It was his misfortune to minister in the worst of times. Inside his walled town waves of refugees poured in during the Thirty Years' War. The war was one of the most destructive conflicts in human history; over eight million people died, not only from military engagements, but from violence, famine and plague.

The plague overwhelmed Pastor Rinkart's town. The other two ministers in town died, leaving Pastor Rinkart to spiritually care for the multitudes alone. It was reported that he conducted 4,000 funerals in one year alone, including for his own wife.

Yet during his own suffering and trials, Pastor Martin Rinkart composed one the greatest hymns of—thanksgiving to God!

Perhaps the writing of this hymn provided therapy and strength for his own spirit. In verse two, there is a prayer; "And keep us all in grace, and guide us when perplexed, and free us all from harm, in this world and the next."

At the end of Matthews's Gospel, Jesus said to the disciples, "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

As people of faith, we can take great comfort in knowing that Jesus is with us always—in our deepest suffering and our greatest challenges. During the coronavirus pandemic, let us remember to pray, giving thanks to God for our salvation in Jesus Christ. We so often focus on the short term in life that we fail to take the long view, confident that we are always surrounded in God's care.

Paul writes, "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus." Romans 8:38-39

I give thanks for each one of you and remember you in my prayers. I look forward to when we can be together again in worship!

A Word of Advice...

Wayne Norman received this information at his work site. This list was compiled by the U.S. Army's CyberCrime Unit out of Quantico, Virginia. It is good advice in these uncertain times...

Be suspicious of anyone who approaches you or initiates contact regarding corona virus.

Be suspicious of anyone you don't know or with whom you did not initiate a conversation who offers you advice on prevention, protection or recovery –especially if they ask for money.

Cybercriminals could use any and many different approaches. Look out for these kinds of approaches:

*Someone claims to represent the health department who emails you or comes to your door and tells you of the risks of COVID-19 and offers you vaccination or other testing. The health department will not do this. This is a dangerous scam. If this happens, call your local police department immediately.

*Someone claiming to be from your bank or an investment firm who you do not already have a relationship with, who offers investment alternatives to protect you from economic and market uncertainties.

*Someone who threatens you with repercussions (arrest, prosecution, confinement) if you don't pay a fee.

*Someone claiming to be from a hospital where a loved one is being treated for the virus but is in urgent need of money before lifesaving treatments can be rendered.

*Someone claiming to be your friend who is stuck in a foreign country and can't get home unless a "virus prevention" or other outrageous sounding fee is paid.

*Unsolicited emails offering expert advice or information. They could contain malware or the links in the email could take you to a site with malware.

*Someone asking for any personally identifiable information, bank account or financial information, or information about family members.
