God's Work, Our Hands

WellSpan Health is seeking volunteers to sew face masks as part of the American Hospital Association's Million Masks campaign. WellSpan's engineering team tested several models of home-sewn masks and has recommended a specific pattern (https://www.wellspan.org/media/2364423/WellSpan-Facemask-making-instructions.pdf). This design has a center pocket in the back for additional filter material that can provide additional protection. The filter materials will be provided and inserted by WellSpan after the masks are washed each time. If you already have a supply of masks from a different pattern, we will gladly accept those as well for our employees who work in non-patient care areas.

Donated masks may be dropped off at this location: 1660 Orchard Drive, Chambersburg between 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday thru Friday. Our preference is for up to 20 masks to be placed in one Ziplock or clear bag, if possible, and multiple bags may be donated at the same time. Solomon's member Carolyn Clouser, who works at Chambersburg Hospital, is also willing to pick up your donations if transportation is an issue.
